ACTION - Limitation Law - whether it can be invoked against a person who is not a party to the action. *Odubeko v. Fowler* (P. 106)

APPEALS - Plaintiff not appealing against trial court's finding on an issue - Court of Appeal's finding on the issue at variance with Plaintiff's pleading - proper consequence thereof. *Ojomo v. Incar Nig Ltd* (P. 53)

APPEALS - Court of Appeal - where trial court by a slip of the pen records pw4 instead of pw3 - whether court of Appeal can correct the slip. *Egboghonome v. The State* (P. 4)

COMPUTATION OF TIME - Pleading a date as when the cause of action arose - whether it is permissible - for court to compute time from such date as pleaded. *Odubeko v. Fowler* (p. 106)

CONFESSIONS - Where Appellant is seen in the vicinity of scene of crime - body of deceased found without its hunchback - Appellant going into hiding after the commission of the offence - whether these facts bear out Appellant's confession that he committed the crime. *Egboghonome v. the State* (P. 53)

CONTRACTS - Where Plaintiff is not a party to a contract-certain clauses to the agreement referring to Plaintiff - whether Plaintiff can maintain action based on the same. *Ojomo v. Incar Nig Ltd* (p. 53)

COURTS - Court formulating weakness of a case and resolving some in favour of one party - whether proper. *Odubeko v. Fowler* (P. 1(6))

COURT OF APPEAL – Where the trial court fails to assess evidence of witnesses, evaluate and form impression on same - whether the Court of Appeal is right to interfere with its findings of fact. *Odubeko v.* (p. 106)

CRIMINAL LAW AND PROCEDURE - Commencement of Proceedings by preliminary investigation - whether the proceedings before the magistrate form part of the proceedings in the high court. Ejelikwu v. The State (P. 146)

CRIMINAL LAW AND PROCEDURE - Where Appellant is charged with culpable homicide punishable with death - found "guilty as charged" - whether the same as conviction for culpable homicide punished with death. Ejelikwu v. The State (p. 146)

CRIMINAL LAW AND PROCEDURE - Accidental slip by trial judge - whether the same can be corrected by the appeal court. Ejelikwu v. The State (p. 146)

CRIMINAL LAW AND PROCEDURE - Failure to take fresh plea after alteration or amendment of charge-whether conviction is rendered invalid thereby. Attah v. The State (p. 77)

DAMAGES - Court unsure of the adequate length of determination of notice - same court awarding a year's commission for breach - whether such an award is proper. Ojomo v. Incar Nig Ltd. (P. 53)

ESTOPPEL - Judicial finding made during the pendency of the action in which the plea of res-judicata is made - whether such finding prevents it from operating as estoppel. Ajakaiye v. The Military Governor of Bendel State (p. 181) SC

EVIDENCE - Certified true copy of a conveyance and a registered instrument - no issue raised by both sides as to genuineness or otherwise - no evidence of discrepancy between the two documents - whether there exists any basis for the courts finding that the documents created doubt. Odubeko v. Fowler (p. 106)

EVIDENCE - Land dispute - certified hand written copy of a typed document - no objection raised as to its certification - whether admissible - whether it is sufficient proof of due execution of Deed of conveyance. Odubeko v. Fowler (p. 106)

EVIDENCE - Address of counsel on exhibits tendered in court viz-a-viz primary evidence of witnesses to the proceedings which is more acceptable. Odubeko v. Fowler (p. 106)

EVIDENCE - Where other evidence of cause of death is cogent and conclusive-whether court can determine cause of death even without medical evidence. Ejelikwu v. The State (p. 146)

EVIDENCE - Evidence used to prove pleaded count in a charge whether it can be admissible to prove the unpleaded counts in that charge. Attah v. The State (P. 77)

EVIDENCE - Counts in a charge framed against distinct acts-whether evidence in proof of each count could stand alone. Attah v. The State (P.77)

EVIDENCE - Contradictions in evidence - which did not affect Credibility - whether they can be ignored by the court. Egboghonome v. The State (P. 1)

EVIDENCE - Failure to call in evidence the Superior Police officer who attested to accused person's confession - whether fatal to the conviction of the accused. Egboghonome v. The State (P. 1)

EVIDENCE - When the extrajudicial confession of an accused person is inconsistent with his testimony - whether the court should disregard both. Egboghonome v. the State (p. 1)

EVIDENCE - Evidence of custom of trade not pleaded by the plaintiff - whether such evidence should be admitted. Ojomo v. Incar Nig Ltd (P. 53)

JURISDICTION - Plea of res judicata - whether it amounts to challenge of court's jurisdiction. Ajakaiye v. Governor of Bendel State (p. 181)

LAND LAW - Two contending Parties in a suit claiming to be in possession of the land in dispute - which of the parties is entitled to succeed. Odubeko v. Fowler (p. 106)

LIMITATION LAW - Where Plaintiff has a cause of action - time specified by the limitation law having elapsed - legal implications. Odubeko v. Fowler (P. 106)

LIMITATION LAW - Statute Bar - accrual of cause of action - on who the onus to establish same lies. Odubeko v. Fowler (P. 106)

LIMITATION LAW - Of Lagos State (s.21) - legal effects of a Party's failure to abide by its provisions. Odubeko v. Fowler (P. 106)

MEDICAL EVIDENCE - Where identification of the body of the deceased is inconclusive due to absence of the identifier - where court can infer cause of death without medical evidence-whether absence of identifier is fatal to prosecution's case. Egboghomome v. The State (p. 1)

PRACTICE AND PROCEDURE - Where an agreement fails to indicate duration of appointment - Plaintiff suggesting duration - whether onus is on him to prove. Ojomo v. Incar Nig Ltd (p. 53)

PRACTICE AND PROCEDURE - Failure of the Applicant to plead estoppel at the trial judgment to be pleaded in estoppel not yet delivered at the time of trial - whether enough explanation of such failure to plead. Ajakaiye v. Governor of Bendel State (P. 181)

RES JUDICATA - Essential ingredients thereof - what must be proved - in order to succeed. Ajakaiye v. Gov. of Bendel State (p. 181)

RES JUDICATA - Where the Parties are not the same in two different cases - Applicant seeking to rely on res judicata - whether he is entitled to succeed. Ajakaiye v. Gov. of Bendel State (p. 181)

SUREME COURT - Previous decisions of Supreme Court in Oladejo v. The State given per incuriam - whether Supreme Court can depart from or overrule it. Egboghomome v. The State (p. 1)
